Thanks too to our Parish Council and our three ward councillors who paid for the second phase with a circular path. The lovely seat was provided by Jill West, the late Chris Proudfoot's partner. Chris was to have overseen the work so his beloved GCNs could thrive and prosper. In a moving ceremony last year at the Waste, Jill asked me to say the transformation of the Waste denoted to her both life and hope, I said I just knew Chris would've given it and us, his blessing.
